Funding – breakdown and explanation

Brook Green centre for Learning claimed £11,836.00 from the Department for Education Summer School Funding scheme. This funding was used to ensure appropriate levels of staffing were available each day of the Summer School, including specialist teaching staff and support staff.

A small amount of the claim was allocated to resourcing practical activities. All students that attended were provided with a cooked lunch and refreshments throughout the day at no charge to students or their families.
